AGENDA ITEM

1. Call Meeting to Order

The meeting of the Permian Basin MPO Policy Board was called to order at 4:02 p.m. by Policy Board Vice-Chair, John Love. A quorum was present.

2. Introductions and Announcements

Every attendee introduced themselves

3. Public Comment Period

Thomas Kerr made a public comment emphasizing on the strong need for bicycle and pedestrian projects within Odessa area.

Gary Law provided various date and information regarding the rise of development within the Northeastern corridor of Midland. He stated that the City of Midland released airway rights within said corridor, and constructing a new water tower, which will potentially provide more development within the area. It was also stated that this information was not available during the scoring process.

4. Approve the Policy Board Minutes from October 30, 2019

A motion was made by John Speed and seconded by Debi Hays to approve the Policy Board Minutes from October 30, 2019. The motion passed unanimously.

5. Approve the September 2019 Billing Statements

September is the twelfth billing period for fiscal year 2019 and reflects the expenditures from Tasks and Subtasks as approved in the FY 2019 UPWP. During the month of September, Permian Basin MPO expended \$18,255.82, which brings the percentage of expenditures to 73.74% of the FY 2019 programmed funds. The balance of funds is \$118,185.60.

A motion was made by John Speed and seconded by Debi Hays to approve the September 2019 Billing Statements. The motion passed unanimously.

6. Approve the Forward 45 Metropolitan Transportation Plan

Staff gave a brief presentation on the draft *Forward 45* Metropolitan Transportation Plan of what the document entails, and an explanation of what changes had been made since the previous meeting.

A motion was made by Debi Hays and seconded by Tom Sprawls to approve the Forward 45 Metropolitan Transportation Plan with the recommended project changes. The motion passed unanimously.

7. Approve a draft list of projects for inclusion in the TxDOT FY 2021 Unified Transportation Program

The TxDOT Odessa District staff met with MPO staff on November 4th to discuss the procedural changes that have been implemented by the Texas Transportation Commission (TTC). In previous years the Permian Basin MPO (and others) have submitted desired projects in the month of April or May after consultation with the Odessa District staff. The TTC wants this timeline moved up so they have more time to consider projects that they will ultimately choose to fund. Therefore, the MPO is now required to submit its list of priority projects for FY 2021 by November 21, 2019 to meet the TTC's objective.

Staff, policy board members and various other attendees held a discussion regarding which topics they wanted to proceed sending to the Texas Transportation Commission. Issues such as right of way availability, funding and where the projects were occurring were some of the concerns addressed during the discussion. It was stated that there will eventually be an opportunity to add other projects to the list. Ultimately, it was decided that the following five projects, including the proposed Category 2 funding, would be sent to the Texas Transportation Commission for approval:
